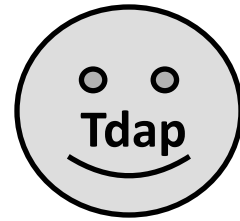
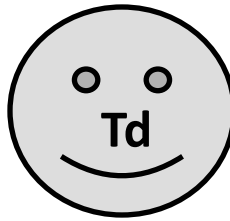





DTaP, Td & Tdap Vaccines

What makes them different?

 DTaP <p>DTP: no longer available in U.S.; P=whole cell pertussis DT: for children who can't have pertussis vaccine</p>	<p><u>D</u>iphtheria <u>T</u>etanus (<u>a</u>cellular) <u>P</u>ertussis</p>	<p>6 weeks through 6 years</p>	<p>4-5 doses</p> <p>Children need 5 doses. Some will only get 4 doses because they got behind in getting their vaccines</p>	<p><u>DTaP</u> Infanrix, Daptacel Tripedia, Acel-Imune</p> <p><u>DTaP+other vaccine</u> Pentacel (DTaP+IPV+Hib) Pediarix (DTaP+IPV+Hep B) Kinrix (DTaP+IPV) TriHIBit (DTaP+Hib)</p>
 Td	<p><u>T</u>etanus <u>d</u>iphtheria</p>	<p>7 years of age and older</p>	<p>1-3 doses</p> <p>Most children will not get any doses because they got enough DTaP vaccine</p>	<p><u>Td</u> Td (generic) Decavac Tenivac</p>
 Tdap	<p><u>T</u>etanus <u>d</u>iphtheria (<u>a</u>cellular) <u>p</u>ertussis</p>	<p>11 years of age and older</p> <p>Using specific rules, MCIR will count some doses given at 10 years of age or younger</p>	<p>1 dose</p> <p>Persons should only get one dose of this vaccine</p>	<p><u>Tdap</u> Adacel Boostrix</p>

*Look closely at the letters!

- Upper case "T" means there is about the same amount of tetanus in DTaP, Tdap and Td.
- Upper case "D" and "P" means there is more diphtheria and pertussis in DTaP than in Tdap and Td; lower case letters ("d" "p") means there is less.
